Reminders of the town's colonial past are evident at every turn. Old barns, stone walls, gracious farmhouses, and wonderful pre-Revolutionary homes are a common sight. Sudbury is the home of the Longfellow's Wayside Inn/Restaurant, built in 1680 and considered to be one of the oldest inns in the nation. The Grist Mill, pictured above is also located on the property along with the Martha Mary Chapel. Each fall, the community welcomes visitors to the Colonial Fair.

Fine schools and town facilities combine with a myriad of recreational opportunities and active civic, social, and charitable organizations to keep residents involved. Commuting is convenient via Routes 128 and Interstate 495, and major shopping malls are just 10 minutes from home. Recreational highlights include the National Wildlife Refuge and the Sudbury River area for canoeing, hiking, and cross-country skiing.
